**Using Behavior Tracking Data to Drive the Implementation of Tier II/III Interventions in an Alternative High School Setting**

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The objective for this presentation is to share Tier II and Tier III strategies that can be implemented with high school students. Our program is an alternative high school setting and takes into account the statewide rationale for implementing positive behavioral supports that are predictable, consistent, positive, and safe. Our framework identifies behavioral needs and implements interventions based on behavior tracking data that are targeted to increase student engagement while developing strategies and evaluating current practices that contribute to student success. Our team includes community participants such as school-based counselors from a local Mental Health Agency and our School Resource Officers from the local Police Department (both are present in our building daily).

The content of our presentation will include our program background, our data collection methods, and our development of interventions based on current data trends. The participants will be able to use three identified strategies for tracking and teaching behavioral expectations described in the presentation. Our behavioral expectations are the 3 Ps: positive, peaceful, productive.

Many strategies have been implemented in our PBIS framework in order to maintain consistency among staff members when teaching expectations and checking in with students. We refer to our system of implementation as "teamwork success." This program includes a real-time Google ratings database that has been created to inform interventions and provide progressive feedback to students. We hold weekly RTI meetings to discuss current data trends seen in our behavior tracking system and make changes to increase effectiveness of strategies being used.

## Acronym Glossary

**BIP:** Behavior intervention plan - a formal plan that schools put in place to help an individual student replace problem behaviors with more positive ones.

**CICO:** Check-in Check-out - an intervention that involves having a student check in with a caring adult at the beginning and end of each school day to discuss progress towards meeting pre-determined goals and expectations that are listed on a monitoring sheet and aligned to the school-wide expectations.

**FBA:** Functional behavioral assessment - a formal analysis of student behavior that seeks to determine the purpose that a problem behavior is serving for a student by identifying antecedents and consequences that are likely contributing to and maintaining the behavior.

**MTSS:** Multi-tiered systems of support - a framework that involves using data-based problem solving to implement academic and behavioral instructional interventions that are proportional to students' needs.

**ODR:** Office discipline referral - a consequence in which a teacher refers a student to the office following an incident of a major problem behavior.

**OSS:** Out-of-school suspension - a consequence in which a student is temporarily removed from school for a specified period of time.

**PBIS:** Positive behavioral interventions and supports - a system of evidence-based supports that involves systematically defining, teaching, modeling, and reinforcing expected behaviors in schools in order to enhance all students' behavioral and academic outcomes, while also promoting positive school climates. PBIS is also referred to as Positive behavioral supports (PBS) and school-wide positive behavioral interventions and supports (SWPBIS).

**SAS:** Self-Assessment Survey - an assessment completed by school personnel that measures their perceptions regarding the implementation of PBIS; tool available at [www.pbisapps.org](http://www.pbisapps.org) with access by contacting your State Support Team PBIS contact.

**SWIS:** School-Wide Information System - an online information system that assists schools with using ODR data to design interventions that address specific school-wide, targeted group and individual needs; tool available at [www.pbisapps.org](http://www.pbisapps.org) with access by contacting your State Support Team PBIS contact to determine readiness and provide team training before the annual subscription is activated.

**TFI:** Tiered Fidelity Inventory - an implementation fidelity tool for evaluating the degree to which a school is implementing the core components of PBIS across three tiers and for data-based decision making for leadership team action planning for sustainability of PBIS implementation; tool available at [www.pbisapps.org](http://www.pbisapps.org) with access by contacting your State Support Team PBIS contact.

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Prior to 2017-2018, the Keystone Local School District had only pieces and parts of PBIS in place with no consistent plan or direction. After proper training from the State Support Team Region 2, the district planned and executed a successful PBIS program across the entire district of over 1,600 students. While the overall PBIS program was developed by the district PBIS team, the matrix, incentive plan, and roll-out was unique to each building with the ultimate goal being student buy-in and effectiveness. All three buildings incorporated relevant and current technology that was engaging to students by using things such as video, Facebook, and Snapchat to get the PBIS message out to the students, staff, and community.

In this presentation, attendees will learn how our district developed our PBIS plan, the individual building matrices, roll-out processes, and incentive program that is developmentally appropriate for the different levels of students within our K-12 district. Attendees will also hear about some of the struggles we encountered both at the district and building level and how we overcame those struggles to keep our eyes on the prize of a successful PBIS system for all students, so that they can maximize their potential, both academically and behaviorally.

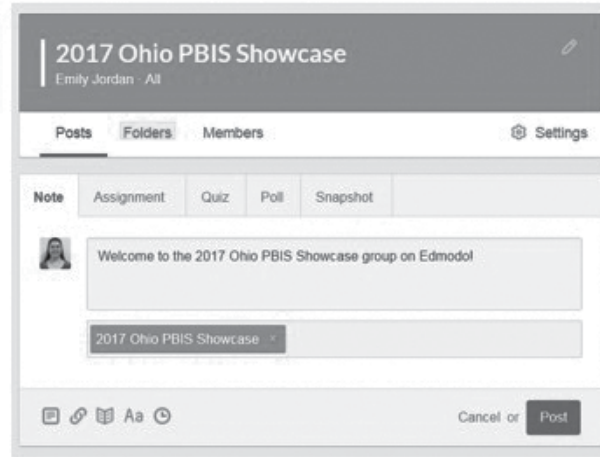

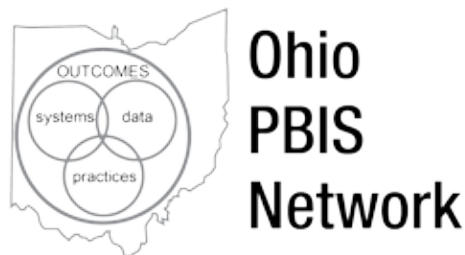
