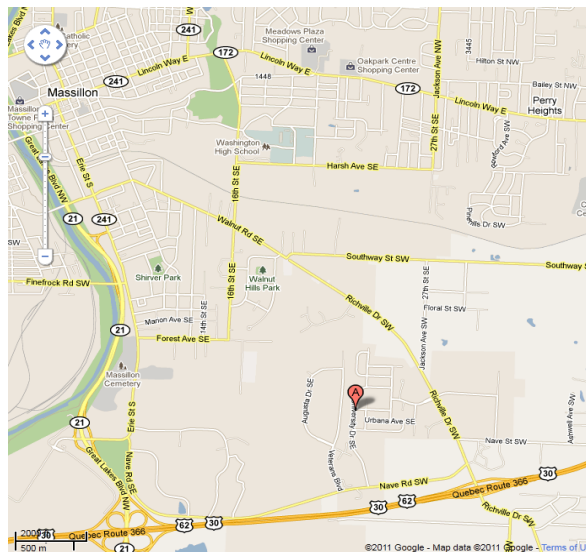

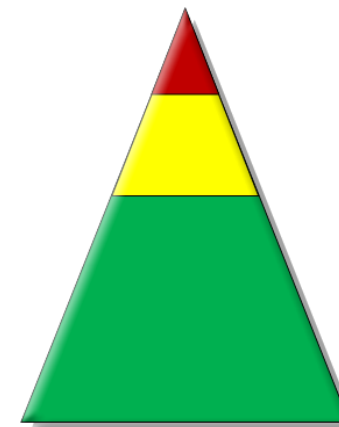

Team membership may also include:

Curriculum Director
School Psychologist
Special Ed Director
Intervention/Title Coach

All team members must commit to attending the entire training series.

SST-9 will provide substitute reimbursement for up to three teachers, per team. Maximum substitute teacher rate is \$100.00 per teacher, per day.
